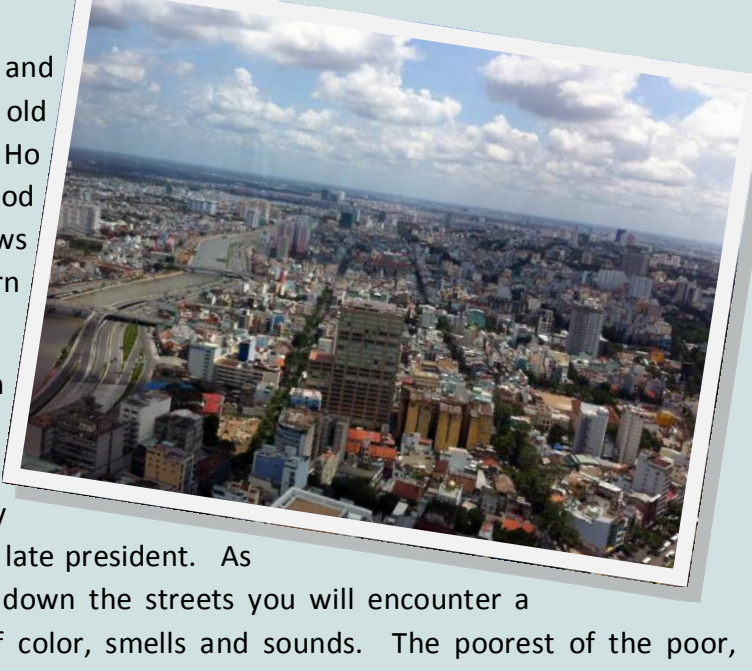


SAVE THE DATE

10/10 Day of Prayer

Ten million people. Ten million men and women, boys and girls, family members, old and young. Ten million people live in Ho Chi Minh City, Vietnam. And yet, God knows every person in this city. He knows them and wants them to repent and turn to follow Him.

Ho Chi Minh City is the largest city in Vietnam and the economic and manufacturing hub of the entire country. **Formerly known as Saigon**, the city was renamed in 1976 in honor of their late president. As

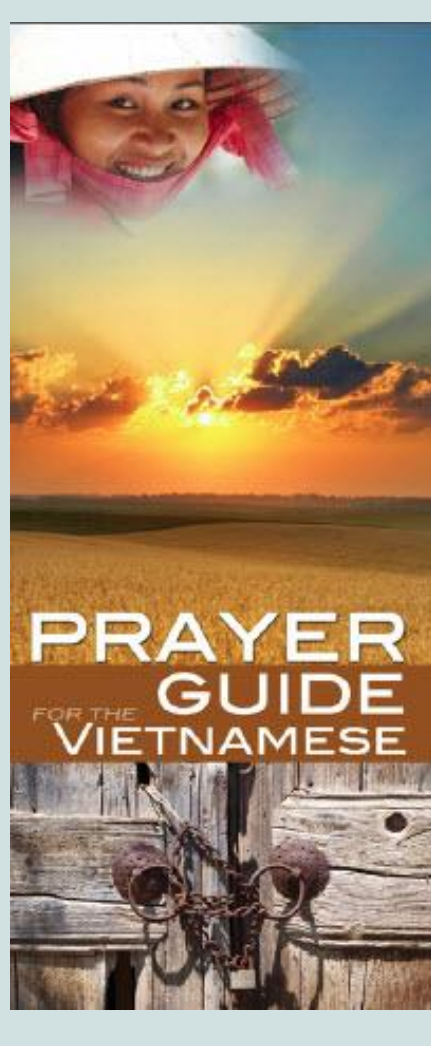

you go down the streets you will encounter a wash of color, smells and sounds. The poorest of the poor, selling lottery tickets or collecting trash; entrepreneurs pushing their wares on carts; shopkeepers; teachers and students; clerical workers; professional business persons and newly emerging wealthy families move through the city, most on motorcycles, like a teeming river filling the streets. There is an almost raucous, boom-town feel to the city with constant activity, new construction and new businesses storming in every day. Yet beneath all of this positive, upwardly mobile veneer, Ho Chi Minh City remains anchored in darkness.

The most predominant form of spirituality is ancestor worship, burning incense and giving sacrifices to the deceased in hopes of securing favor and warding off harm. In addition to their ancestor worship many also follow Buddhism, Cao Dai or a unique form of syncretistic Vietnamese Catholicism. Each of these religious expressions show a people **seeking to fill an emptiness** and assurance of salvation only found in God.

With ten million in population, the number is so large that it's **mind boggling**. Many of us can't even hold a number that big in our mind. Within that ten million however, scarcely 2% has found the hope and joy of salvation in Jesus Christ. If you **do the math** based on the average mortality rate in Vietnam, every ten minutes a lost person dies in Ho Chi Minh City and goes to Hell. It may be hard to wrap our head around 10 million, but we can all understand 'every 10 minutes'. 10 million. Every 10 minutes. **On 10 / 10, join us in praying for the lost of Ho Chi Minh City. 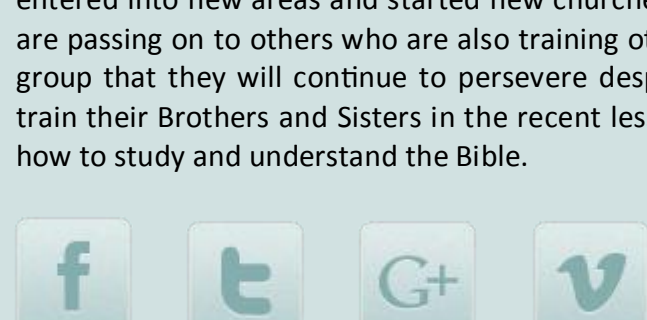

Two Brothers from the Oslin group practice using a simple method of Bible study.

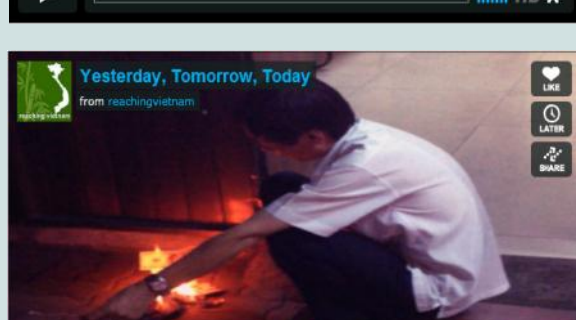


What does Social Media have to do with prayer?

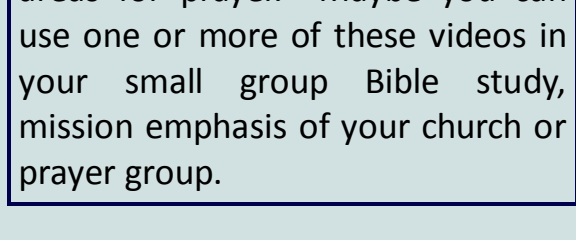
