The low rumble of literally millions of motorcycles fills your ears as you move down most every road. Billboard sized display windows line the sidewalks along numerous upscale shopping malls touting any luxury brand imaginable; Gucci, Jimmy Choo, Burberry, Tag Heuer . . . . Other global brands continue to move in both as factory floor and marketplace. Early mornings the street cafes are filled to capacity as workers blue and white collar alike prepare for their day with an iced coffee. Construction cranes are found on the horizon facing any point of the compass. The night sky is awash with color from the lights of restaurants, shops, bars and entertainment spots accompanied by the

mixed sounds of Vietnamese and American pop music. The net result combines into something of a frontier boomtown atmosphere that is Ho Chi Minh City. Most are left with an impression that is positive and upbeat. **Unfortunately, on closer examination** things are not so good. For all of its positive elements, this city of 10 million people is plunged

in darkness. At least 98% of these urban residents are involved in ancestor worship. On a regular basis you can see them praying and offering incense or other sacrifices to spirits they believe to be their dead ancestors. Bowing and offering sacrifices to spirits or following Buddhism, Taoism Cao Dai, goddess worship and a myriad of other spiritual expressions is likewise common. Hundreds of temples and ancestor halls can be found and literally millions of other altars all stealing the worship that is rightly due to God our Father. It leaves the men and women, boys and girls of this city covered in darkness, blindly looking for hope where none can be found. You have the opportunity to join with us in turning back that




